PROGRAM COMMITMENT

The Stonehill College Investment Finance Initiative is a multi-year course of study designed to enhance the critical thinking and analytical skills of participants through hands-on academic and security analysis experience. It combines a demanding course of study with internships, mentoring and management of real-money to represent a truly differentiated experience for our students and participating professionals. Admission is through an application process. The SCIFI Academic Committee will considerer for admission only those students that have demonstrated a strong intellect, an interest in the field, and a willingness to work very hard. Students admitted to the program agree to take the following 2 courses in the fall and spring of the academic year, in addition to the commitments related to the Herlihy Opportunity Fund.

BUS 432 – Applied Research and Portfolio Management (3 credits) – Offered in the fall semester, this course is designed to develop a student's understanding of the investment analysis and portfolio management process. Emphasis is placed on such topics as: industry research, equity analysis, valuation tools, portfolio management fundamentals, derivatives and alternative investments.

BUS 490 – Directed Study in Finance (3 credits) – Offered in the spring semester, this course enables individual paths of study in the field of investment finance while permitting continued direct involvement in the Student Run Investment Fund. All students enrolled in BUS490 will be required to meet together on a weekly basis and meet specific academic requirements.

Mary Herlihy Opportunity Fund Management – Participants play a direct role in the management of the student run fund and are therefor are required to commit at least an additional 2-3 hours per week engaged in activities as an analyst for the fund. Participants are ambassadors for the fund and will be required to participate/attend the SCIFI Speaker Series and related workshops, mentor interested students and engage the participation of alumni investment professionals.
