Dear Applicant:

Thank you for expressing interest in the Domestic H.O.P.E. Service Immersion Program over Winter, Spring & Summer Break. You will form community with other students; learn about another culture, history and issues of social justice; and continue to pursue justice after your return. This year Campus Ministry is sponsoring thirteen domestic experiences for members of the Stonehill community. H.O.P.E. trips prove to be one of the more significant experiences of a student's Stonehill College career. We travel to these places with the hope of discovering a new sense of community, which crosses the many borders of race, culture, land, and language.

Because of the nature of the experience, we ask that you think seriously about the commitment you will be making, and that you accept the responsibilities that it demands. Several things will be expected of you, including (1) being present at weekly orientation sessions that will be held on **Wednesdays from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 pm**; (2) actively participating in fundraising events (letter writing, bake sales, group fundraisers, etc.); (3) while on-site, fully participating in the service project(s) and the reflection sessions; and (4) participating in the 're-entry' program.

<u>Our Mission</u>: Inspired by the enduring values of a Holy Cross education, and believing that learning is enhanced when it takes place in the context of a compelling situation, H.O.P.E. (Honoring our neighbors, Organizing for justice, Practicing peace, and Encountering God) seeks to engage members of the Stonehill community in cross-cultural service experiences. H.O.P.E. further endeavors to challenge the Stonehill community to grow in love of God and neighbor by embodying the Church's commitment to a preferential option for and with the poor.

<u>Talk it Over with Friends & Family</u>: Your decision to participate in this type of experience should not be made in isolation. We encourage you to speak with friends and family about your decision prior to applying for the program. Their reflections and concerns could be helpful in clarifying your own thoughts about particular areas and/or practical concerns.

<u>Application & Selection Process</u>: Please complete the application, and return it to Campus Ministry by **Friday, October 4**th **by 3:00 pm**. Interviews will also be required and will take place from **October 7**th-**18**th in Campus Ministry. This program is highly competitive, so you must thoroughly express your commitment through the application and interview. If selected, you will be notified on **Friday, October 25**rd asked to confirm participation by **Friday, November 1**st by submitting all forms and first payment.

<u>Health Concerns</u>: (a) On the application, please inform us of any medical history/current conditions, which we should be aware of on this trip. (b) Health insurance is required of anyone who will make any of the trips. If you are on the Stonehill College Plan, you are covered out of state. If you are on your family's plan, you may not be covered for medical emergencies out of state; in that case would need to purchase an insurance rider. Please consult your family on this matter. Again, to participate in any trip, you must be covered by medical insurance.

For all travel, it is suggested that you receive a flu vaccination prior to departure as we desire to keep the vulnerable populations we serve healthy.

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<u>Payment & Fundraising</u>: You are responsible for payment & fundraising towards administrative cost of the program. All deposits of \$200 (*for most trips*) must be paid by **November 1**st. H.O.P.E. Domestic received a large grant from the Flatley Foundation to assist in the costs of domestic program. Because of this generous grant, we are able to price domestic trips at a much lower rate. All those flying have an added cost due to the airfare but it will still only be a portion of the total cost. The total cost of the trip will vary per site. A payment schedule will be given to you after acceptance, but airfare payment must be made by Friday, December 6th at 3:00 p.m. **Students must raise or pay their cost in full, in order to be able to go on the trip.**

We recognize that financial hardship could prohibit some students from applying and participating in the program. We have the opportunity to provide *some* need-based scholarships to reduce your obligations to the program. Please see MaryAnne Cappelleri in Campus Ministry for more information after you receive acceptance.

<u>Selection</u>: We are delighted by the strong interest in these trips. The selection process is always difficult, and we will not be able to place all applicants on the trip. The selection committee will be fair and choose groups that will facilitate a good experience at each site. If you are placed on a trip, a non-refundable deposit of \$200 is due Friday, November 1st.
