As an educator and a parent of a child with autism, Dr. Thierfield Brown will share her personal story of how her life has been impacted by autism. Dr. Thierfield Brown, Ed.D, is Director of Student Services at the University Of Connecticut School Of Law. She has worked in Disability Services for 35 years. She consults at many higher education institutions and is a frequent keynote speaker at conferences on Asperger's Syndrome. Dr. Brown has published three books; A Professional Guide to Students with Asperger's Syndrome in Higher Education, 2009, The Parent's Guide to College for Students on the Autism Spectrum, 2012 and Behavior Management and Self-Regulation for Adults, 2012. Dr. Brown consults with colleges, students and families around the country on issues for students with autism spectrum disorders. She has three children, the youngest being a 21 year old son on the spectrum.

Tuition Exchange and Remission Applications Due to HR October 25th

Please be advised that applications for both the **Tuition Exchange and Tuition Remission Programs for the 2014-2015 Academic Year** will be due in the HR Office by 4:30 pm on Friday October 25, 2013.

Tuition Exchange ("TE") is a scholarship program open to dependent children of eligible Stonehill College employees. Under the TE benefit program, eligible dependents of employees may apply for tuition scholarships at more than 650 other TE member institutions nationwide. Since the number of Stonehill TE exchanges in any academic year is limited, recipients are selected on a basis of prioritized eligibility criteria described within the tuition exchange guidelines found on the HR Website. Please be advised that filling out the application forms below does not guarantee eligibility or admission.

For all eligible employees who would like to request Tuition Exchange recertification/renewal for the 2014-2015 academic year, please click here: <u>Tuition Exchange Award Renewal for 2014-2015(.doc)</u>. All Applicants for TE will be notified by early December 2013.

Tuition Remission ("TR") is open to the spouse and dependent children of eligible employees. Eligible dependent children of employees may apply for 100% tuition credit at Stonehill College or other participating Congregation of Holy Cross institutions.

All eligible employees who will be requesting **Tuition Remission** for their dependents for the 2014-2015 academic year will need to complete the form located here: <u>Tuition Remission Notification Form</u>.

Please note that Tuition Remission may only be granted for those employees' dependents attending Stonehill College, King's College in PA or Our Lady of Holy Cross in LA. Please be advised that filling out the Notification Form does not guarantee eligibility or admission.

Spotlight On: Akira Motomura, Associate Professor of Economics and Department Chair

Each month, an employee of the college will be highlighted here as a way to get to know each other better in this growing community. This month, we are highlighting Akira Motomura, Associate Professor of Economics and Department Chairperson. Here is his story:

Professor Motomura came to Stonehill College in 1995. Prior to Stonehill he taught at Albion College in Albion, MI as well as Barnard College (an affiliate to Columbia University) in New York City, NY. When Professor Motomura applied to Stonehill he was most interested in continuing his work at a liberal arts institution. When he was offered the position and arrived on campus, he saw this as an opportunity for so much more. Initially, this was a great opportunity for Akira to continue teaching Economic History, something he has always enjoyed. Later, he created and developed a course on Sports Economics, in which he has also developed a research expertise. In all of his classes, he pushes his students to think about the "normal", go beyond it, question it and don't just accept it blindly as the final answer. As a Professor at Stonehill, he feels supported to provide students with the foundation they need to apply theory to conventional economic issues, explore contemporary and encourage students to look at the whole picture while providing them the tools they need to be successful in their field.

When I asked Professor Motomura why he chose to study in the field of Economics, and specifically the field of Sports Economics, he shared with me that he started his undergraduate experience studying History at Yale University. Shortly after his early years, he knew he wanted to stay involved in history, just with a twist of Economics added to it. He later earned his PhD. from Northwestern University in Economics. Professor Motomura was drawn to the analytical nature of Economics and knew this field would help him educate others as well as help people who were less fortunate. As the field of Economics focuses on the study of how people, businesses and government make decisions and the societal impact of those decisions, he knew this field would motivate him and others to be more independent.

On a personal note, Professor Motomura grew up in San Francisco, CA. He enjoys returning to visit a brother who resides in Los Angeles, Immigration and Citizenship Law Professor at UCLA. As a resident of Norwood, Akira and his wife Gail, a Cognitive Psychologist have been married for 16 years and together they enjoy balancing the needs (and schedule) of their teenage daughter, Janna. When they are not traveling by car to Janna's tennis classes or other activities, they enjoy traveling by plane. This summer they enjoyed a trip to Japan and China where they visited with extended family. Two years ago, they enjoyed a family trip to London and Paris.

In closing, I asked Professor Motomura what he enjoyed most at Stonehill College and he responded with, "Stonehill is a great place to work. It allows me to educate and encourage talented students as well as partner with gifted colleagues." Additionally, he likes the way that Stonehill continues to evolve into a dynamic institution with a real academic purpose and never losing the focus of being a caring institution while educating the minds and hearts of every student.
