



LIBERAL ARTS - HUMANITIES | English, History, American Studies, Religion, Gender Studies, Philosophy, Languages, Visual and Performing Arts

This session is designed for students who may be interested in pursuing a major in the humanities. Current students and faculty from a variety of majors will be featured. In addition to the classroom experience, opportunities to learn beyond the classroom will be discussed.

LIBERAL ARTS - SOCIAL SCIENCES | Political Science & International Studies, Economics, Interdisciplinary Studies, Communication, Sociology, Criminology, Pre-Law Advising

This session is designed for students who may be interested in pursuing a major in the social sciences. The presentation will include both current social science students and faculty who will discuss their experiences in their programs.

SCIENCE PANEL | Biochemistry, Biology, Chemistry, Neuroscience, Physics and Astronomy, Environmental Sciences, Interdisciplinary Studies – Health Sciences, Health and Allied Health (Pre-med, Pre-dent, Pre-PA) Advising

This session will be most helpful for students who may be interested in pursuing a major in the natural sciences, health (medical, dental, optometry, podiatry, chiropractic, and veterinary) or allied health (physician assistant, nurse practitioner, nursing, physical therapy, pharmacy, etc.) careers. The science panel will begin with a presentation led by students and faculty on the opportunities available to science majors. Interested students are invited to return at 1:15 PM to room 141 of the Shields Science Center for a tour of the classrooms and labs.

BUSINESS PANEL | Accounting, Finance, International Business, Management, Marketing, Economics, Healthcare Administration

Information will be provided on all programs offered for those students interested in pursuing a Business, Economics or Healthcare Administration major. Students will discuss course offerings, internships, professional placements after graduation and the advantages of studying business in an AACSB accredited program.

PSYCHOLOGY PANEL | Psychology

Faculty will lead a panel presentation by students followed by a tour of the Psychology observation rooms and laboratories in the Shields Science Center. This panel is for students who have an interest in Psychology as a major.

Representatives from each academic program as well as many other on-campus services will be available to meet individually with students to discuss specific options and answer any questions.

3+2 ENGINEERING, MATH, & COMPUTER SCIENCE

Professor Ralph Bravaco and students will review traditional Math and Computer Science majors as well as discuss the details of our 3+2 Engineering program with The University of Notre Dame.

UNDECLARED PANEL

Unsure of what your major will be? Thinking of beginning your college career exploring different courses as you discover your major? This session will provide an introduction to the academic advising services that assist students in discovering their major. The discussion will also provide an overview of our Cornerstone Program ,which engages all students across the disciplines.

INTERNSHIPS & CAREER SERVICES

Representatives from the Office of Career Services and students will provide examples of our comprehensive domestic and international internship program available to students of all majors. This session will also provide an overview of the many resources available to students to help them prepare for life after Stonehill.

EDUCATION PANEL | Early Childhood, Elementary Education, Secondary Education

Students and faculty will describe the Department of Education Studies' process of teacher development. This includes student teaching and the 9 licensure programs that lead to initial licensure from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.

ADMISSION & FINANCIAL AID

Members of the Admission and the Student Financial Services Offices will discuss Stonehill's approach to application review, merit scholarships, and provide an overview of the need-based financial aid process.

STONEHILL ATHLETICS AND RECREATIONAL SPORTS

Members of the Athletics Department will present on the athletic culture at Stonehill. This is also an excellent opportunity to learn more about the Stonehill Skyhawks, our 20 varsity teams, 10 intercollegiate clubs, and multiple intramural programs.

STUDENT LIFE | Residence Life, Student Activities, Intercultural Affairs, Campus Ministry

This panel will give you a feel for daily life for students at Stonehill. Topics will include On-Campus Clubs, Community Service, Campus Ministry and Campus Events. Stonehill offers over 70 clubs and organizations and sponsors frequent on-campus events throughout the semester.

STUDY ABROAD

The Office of International Programs will discuss with students of all majors, the many semester-long international opportunities available to them during their college career.
