I am the Principal Investigator of the PACT Lab. The PACT (Politics, Activism, Culture, And Threat) Lab investigates through cultural political psychological methods the meaning-making processes of threat and how it leads to both activism and the restriction of rights and its impact on policy. My most recent book, *Psychology in Policy: Redefining Politics Through the Individual*, examines how political psychological research has fails to account for the individual and proposes a new framework for cultural political psychology.

Drawing on my experience as a policy advisor in Congress, the PACT Lab investigates policy-relevant issues, such as company's use of performative vs. substantive activism in attracting customers, collaborations with colleagues in Business schools on signaling trust to consumers, a systematic review on the dehumanizing state of psychological research of life in prison; a mixed-methods study analyzing the meaning-making process of seeing a memorial honoring both the Union and the Confederacy on one's campus, experimental manipulations of disproving one's meta-perceptions and using machine learning to read qualitative messages between partners to predict conditions; and how one's perceived threat impacts the restrictions of rights on the border of citizenship.
