The newly built Thomas and Donna May School of Arts & Sciences is home to the Philosophy, History and Religious Studies & Theology departments. It offers modern, technology-driven classrooms, collaborative study spaces, seminar rooms and McCarthy Auditorium, a large and comfortable space for lectures, presentations and concerts. The building's light-filled atrium connects an Au Bon Pain and the Skyhawk Shop, where you'll find Stonehill gear and apparel.



AACSB-accredited Business Administration programs, our No. 1 ranked Healthcare Administration Department and multifaceted Economics Department. It has a Bloomberg room, capital markets room and many high-tech collaborative spaces. The main floor is dominated by a great room with a wall-length fireplace, comfortable seating and a soaring ceiling. GiGi's Café offers bowls, salads and paninis made with fresh whole ingredients.



The Duffy Academic Center houses professors from many disciplines, including the Mathematics and Languages, Literatures & Cultures departments. It's a hub for services and resources that maximize each student's academic, professional and personal development such as Academic Advising, Intercultural Affairs, Residence Life and the Registrar.



The second-floor houses a multi-station cafeteria serving a wide variety of traditional and ethnic fare, a salad bar, bakery and two expansive light-filled dining rooms. On the lower level is The Hill, a contemporary eatery for light meals that has a pool table, performance stage and Brother Mike's, a pub for students over 21. The first floor is also home to our mail room, radio station and Office of Student Engagement.



This portion of the tour route passes three of Stonehill's seven corridor-style residence halls. These buildings feature common area kitchens, laundry rooms and accessible bathrooms. Stonehill also has several townhouse and suite-style student housing options. Nearly 90% of students live on campus.



The Thomas and Mary Shields Science Center is home to our Biology, Chemistry, Physics & Astronomy, and Psychology departments. It offers state-of-the-art laboratories and research facilities. Our science students have access to equipment that is often only available in graduate programs. A large glass-walled atrium (which hosts campus concerts and other events) and Dunkin' coffee shop make this a popular gathering place for students.



The College Center is home to the Computer Science and Education Studies departments, which comprises five education licensure and non-licensure programs. Merkert Gymnasium is the home court for our men's and women's basketball and volleyball teams. Adjacent to this building is the Martin Institute, home to the Political Science & International Studies Department and our top-ranked Sociology & Criminology Department.



Daily Masses are celebrated in various chapels on campus, including here at the Chapel of Mary. In a wing adjacent to the chapel, you will find Health Services, Counseling Services and Campus Ministry, which offers several faith-based opportunities along with domestic and international service programs.



Cushing-Martin is home to the Communication, English and Visual & Performing Arts departments. It features rehearsal and studio spaces, a student-run graphic design service and the Carole Calo Gallery for art shows. Also inside is our Career Development Center, an important and much-used resource for students seeking research, co-op and internship opportunities or launching their career search.



In addition to its extensive collections of books and periodicals, the MacPháidín Library has state-of-the-art learning spaces, including the Flynn Discovery and Collaboration Classroom, used for training and class presentations, and the Digital Innovation Lab, which features emerging technologies that enhance digital learning such as a podcast studio, virtual reality room and computer workstations.

### Additional points of interest



The Sally Blair Ames Sports Complex is at the heart of an extensive array of indoor and outdoor resources for athletics, intramurals, club sports, and fitness, yoga and spin programs. It has a stunning two-floor, glass-walled weight and fitness center, a dance studio and a field house with tennis/basketball courts and a jogging track. Stonehill has 23 NCAA Division I teams in the Northeast Conference and offers numerous intramural and club sports as well as group exercise classes. Adjacent to the "SpoCo" is W.B. Mason Stadium.



The Farm at Stonehill grows fresh organic produce and distributes it to four community partner organizations. In addition to offering service opportunities for students, it also serves as a living classroom for courses in the sciences, business and humanities.

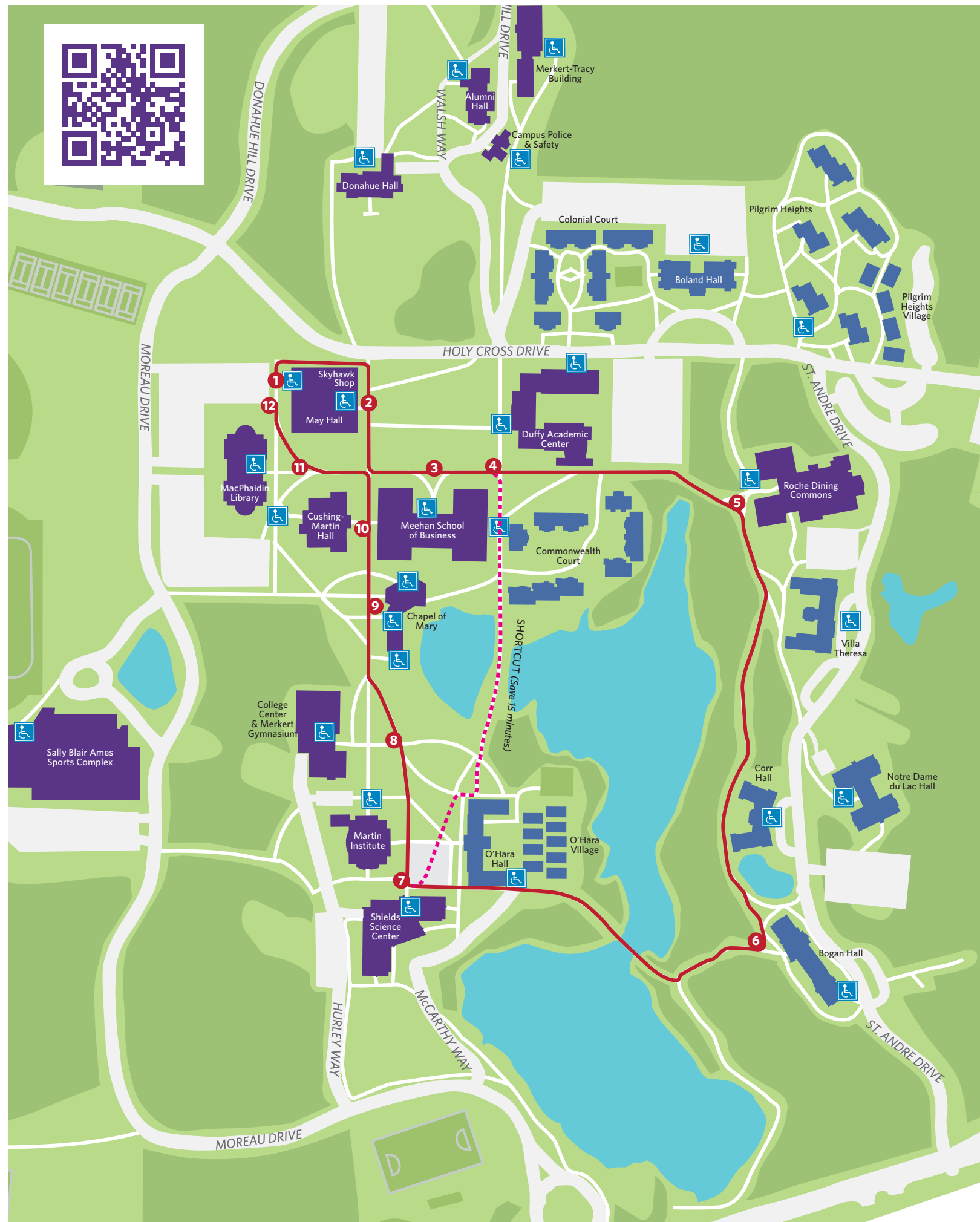
# WELCOME!
