JOHN A. BADWEY, PhD

August 4, 1948 - July 14, 2004

Dr. John Badwey of Fairhaven, MA, 54, died unexpectedly at his home on July 14, 2004. Born in Fall River, John attended Coyle High School in Taunton and graduated from Stonehill College in 1970 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Biology before his graduate work in biochemistry at UMass. John had a distinguished career in biochemistry as an associate professor at Harvard Medical School's Department of Biological Chemistry and Molecular Pharmacology.

For the past quarter-century, since earning a Ph.D. in biochemistry from the University of Massachusetts in Amherst, John conducted cutting-edge research into how white blood cells fend off attacks from microbes.

"He's one of the world-class investigators in the enzyme system that white blood cells have to generate the oxygen radicals that are responsible for killing microbes," said Charles Serhan, Director of the Center for Experimental Therapeutics at Brigham and Women's Hospital, where Dr. Badwey worked as a research scientist. *"His work focused on how the body defends itself from microbes."*

John was well regarded in the scientific community, reviewing other microbiologists' grant proposals for the National Institutes of Health. As a biochemist on the faculty of Harvard Medical School, he specialized in studying infectious diseases. John became preeminent in his field of biochemistry and reached the top of American science; he was appointed to study sections at the National Institutes of Health and the Centers for Disease Control.

In 1988 with his move to Fairhaven permanently, John commuted into Boston. John served on the Fairhaven Board of Health, leading a public education campaign about West Nile virus and Lyme Disease. He was an active member of the town's Historical Society. John was never too serious to talk about his passion for the Red Sox or the Patriots or his love of fishing, particularly saltwater surf casting. "He was a good and decent guy who had a lot of friends," his brother said. John was unmarried but had a longtime girlfriend.

John was survived by two brothers, Louis and Mark, his dear nieces Sabrina and Stefanie, all of Fairhaven, and two uncles, Ernest Hassey of Dartmouth and Victor of Florence, SC. There was a funeral Mass at St. Anthony of the Desert Church in Fall River, with burial in St. Patrick's Cemetery in Fall River.

Word of Nick's death spread quickly through a town where he was a stranger to few. "He was always smiling, always happy. He was a wonderful person who tried to make people feel good," said Selectman Richard Cole, a friend whose wife was a classmate of Nick's at Cardinal Spellman High School. "You always felt better when he was around."

Born in Brockton, Nick was the husband of Elaine F. (Chisholm' 70) Chiros and son of Patricia R. (Stevens) and the late Dr. Nicholas Chiros. Following his graduation from Cardinal Spellman High School in 1965, he completed his studies at Stonehill College in 1970. He was an MIS operations manager for a private company in the Brockton area for 19 years.

Blessed with a lively, gentle sense of humor, Nick helped organize spirited middle school haunted houses in recent years and served as a youth soccer coach for the last ten years. He was also an antique lover who would rise early on Saturdays to have the first crack of the offerings at local flea markets. In addition, Nick liked to drive a motorboat his parents kept near their cottage at Buttermilk Bay.

"He was a big guy with a heart of gold," a town official said. "Nicky had a glint in his eye and a story to tell." On walks through town with him, Nick displayed an amazing memory of the characters and flow of events in the town's history, recalling former residents of homes they would pass and the changes in the small town where he had lived his entire life.

He graduated in 1965 from Catholic Memorial High School in West Roxbury. He received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Accounting from Stonehill College in 1970 and a master's degree in business and education in 1974 from Bridgewater State College. He later earned an MBA from Boston College.

Dan lived in Norwood for 30 years before moving to Walpole 25 years ago. He worked his way through the Walpole school system, beginning as a guidance counselor at Bird Middle School. Next, Dan transferred into a role as public schools' business manager. He then became an assistant superintendent in 1994.

" He was a real people person. He loved to reach out to the community and the students. Dan was always worried about work, even in his last days. He met every challenge as just a bump in the road," said his wife, Maureen.

Dan was diagnosed with Hodgkin's disease when he was 16. Years later, he underwent full-body radiation. Because of the treatment, his heart began to fail, and his immune system created problems affecting his nerves. In June 1997, he had a heart transplant, which allowed him to resume a normal life and gave him a new objective his wife recalled: *"He wanted to encourage others to donate organs, and maybe they could give someone else a fresh life."*

In 1998, Dan was chosen as "Man of the Year" by the Walpole Friends of St. Patrick for his work ethic and the adoption of nine children during his marriage. After his death, the flag at City Hall was lowered to half-staff.

"He was greatly loved, " said his wife. "It didn't matter if you were the custodian, a student, or doctor; he treated you the same way."

Superintendent Kathleen Smith said, *"Dan was the heart and soul of the school."*

In addition to his wife, he was survived by four daughters, Jodie of Lynn, and Erica, Megan, and Nora, all of Walpole: three sons, Joshua of Marshfield, and John B. and Raymond of Walpole and two deceased sons Shawn and Robert; two sisters, Marcia Feeney-Gearty of Norwood, and Janet Feeney-McTeague of Buzzards Bay; and a brother, Martin W. of Norwood MA.

In 2005 a new school in Walpole was named ***The Daniel Feeney Preschool Center*** to honor Dan.
