- 1. Only in rare circumstances will a student in the 2nd year and above be allowed to take more than 20 credits in a given semester.
- 2. First-year students may petition to register for a maximum of two 1-credit courses in a semester, up to the established credit limit, but may not take an additional 3- or 4-credit course.
- 3. Students must complete a Credit Overload Application (COA) and have a minimum semester GPA or cumulative GPA of 3.30 to be approved for a credit overload.
- 4. ROTC students will automatically be approved to take ROTC courses as overloads, but overload charges may apply.
- 5. Courses taken through SACHEM and other consortium programs count toward the credit maximums for each class year.
- 6. Registration for a credit overload will normally take place the week prior to the beginning of each semester. Exceptions may be made for courses without enrollment caps (e.g. Directed Studies, Internships, 1-credit music courses...etc.)
- 7. The Director of Academic Services & Advising, in connection with the Standards & Standing Committee, may approve academic exceptions to this policy in the case of extenuating circumstances.
