



Humanity in Action

Humanity in Action is an intensive and demanding five-week summer Fellowship program that brings together international groups of 40 college students and recent graduates to explore human rights-centered conflicts in Europe. Separate programs take place in **Amsterdam, Berlin, Copenhagen, Paris, and Warsaw**. Each program is highly interdisciplinary, and features daily lectures and discussions with renowned academics, journalists, politicians, and activists, as well as site visits to government agencies, non-profit and community organizations, museums, and memorials. The programs seek to highlight different models of action to remedy injustice.

Eligibility

Competitive Applicants:

- must be currently enrolled undergraduate students (sophomores, juniors or seniors) or recent graduates at accredited, four-year undergraduate U.S. colleges/universities; (all majors and academic disciplines are encouraged to apply)

Selection Criteria

- Demonstrated commitment to minority rights and social justice
- Evidence of leadership potential
- Significant academic achievement
- Entrepreneurship and social maturity
- Maturity, proactiveness, self-reliance

Application Deadline

- Early January
