- Typically a BA interdisciplinary major must be composed of 12-20 3- or 4-credit courses. Courses must be selected from at least three academic programs. Each program needs to be represented by a minimum of three courses, and at least two of the courses must be at the 300 level of above.
- Typically a BS interdisciplinary major must be composed of 16-22 3- or 4-credit courses. The BS in interdisciplinary studies must include at least 16 required science, technology, engineering, and mathematics courses. Courses must be selected from at least three academic programs. Each program needs to be represented by a minimum of three courses, and at least two of the courses must be at the 300 level or above.
- No more than 50% of the courses may be applied to fulfill the requirements of another major.
- The program must include an appropriate senior capstone experience.
