



James Madison Fellowship

The James Madison Memorial Fellowship Foundation offers up to \$24,000 in Graduate Fellowships to individuals seeking to become teachers of the American Constitution at the secondary school level (grades 7–12). Applicants compete against other applicants from the state of their legal residence. Generally, one Fellowship per state is awarded each year.

Eligibility

Competitive Applicants:

- must be U.S. citizens or U.S. nationals;
- must be teachers, or plan to become teachers, of American history, American government, or social studies at the secondary school level (grades 7–12); and
- possess a bachelor's degree or plan to receive a bachelor's degree no later than August 31 of the year in which they are applying.

Selection Criteria

- Commitment to a career teaching American history/American government/social studies at the secondary school level
- Demonstrated intent to complete a program of graduate study that emphasizes the Constitution and offers instruction in that subject
- Demonstrated devotion to civic responsibility
- Demonstrated capacity for study/performance as classroom teachers
- Proposed courses of graduate study
