



Marshall Scholarship

Marshall Scholarships are issued each year to 40 young Americans to study for a degree in the United Kingdom. Their direct engagement with Britain through its best academic programs contributes to their ultimate personal success. Students may apply for a **one-year** or **two-year** grant and must choose **two** preferred universities; those interested in studying at universities other than Oxford, Cambridge and LSE are especially welcomed.

Eligibility

Competitive Applicants:

- must be U.S. citizens (at the time they apply for a scholarship);
- must hold an undergraduate degree from an accredited U.S. four-year college/university;
- have a minimum of 3.7 (or A-) on their undergraduate degree. Exceptions will be considered only on the specific recommendation of the sponsoring college; and
- must not have studied for, or hold a degree from a British University.

Selection Criteria

- Academic merit
- Leadership potential
- Ambassadorial potential

Award Benefits

- Covers room & board, tuition/fees, travel to and from the U.S., books, and study-related travel

Application Deadline

- Early October
