



National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship

The National Science Foundation's Graduate Research Fellowship Program (GRFP) helps ensure the vitality of **science and engineering** in the U.S. and reinforces its diversity. The program supports graduate students in NSF-supported science, technology, engineering, and mathematics disciplines who are pursuing research-based **master's and doctoral degrees** at accredited US institutions. The NSF welcomes applications from all qualified students and strongly encourages under-represented populations, including women, under-represented racial and ethnic minorities, and persons with disabilities, to apply for this fellowship.

Fellows benefit from a **three-year annual stipend of \$32,000** along with a **\$12,000 cost of education allowance** for tuition and fees (paid to the institution), opportunities for international research and professional development, and the freedom to conduct their own research at any accredited U.S. institution of graduate education they choose. NSF receives over **14,000** applications every year and awards **2,000 fellowships**.

Eligibility

Competitive Applicants:

- must be US citizens, US nationals, or permanent residents;
- intend to pursue a research-based Master's or Ph.D. program in an NSF-supported field (see Program Solicitations for specific eligible fields);
- must be enrolled in an eligible program at an accredited U.S. graduate institution by the upcoming Fall;
- must have completed no more than 12 months of full-time graduate study (or the equivalent) as of last August; and
- must meet all other eligibility requirements as set forth in the current Program Solicitation.

Application Deadline

- Determined by your primary field of study listed on "Proposed Graduate Program" section of the application
