Mid-Semester Assessments



- Indicator of current progress and are not final grades.
 - Guide students towards improvement and success
 - Required for all students, from all courses
- Direct, specific feedback from faculty
- Invitation for follow up with professors

- MSAs due from faculty October 13th, posted in myHill a few days later.

Course Selection: Degree Requirements



- Credits: 120 credits total
 - Average 30 credits per year
- GPA: 2.0 cumulative, major, and minor
- Program requirements: Cornerstones, major courses



Course Selection: Cornerstones

- Introductory courses:
 - Religious Studies, Philosophy typically first year
 - Literature, History
 - FYS double-dipped with any introductory cornerstone
- Upperclass courses:
 - CIT, Moral Inquiry, Writing in Disciplines
- Distribution courses: Natural Science, Social Science, Statistical Reasoning – no set year, many double-dip in majors

Advising tool: myAudit

- Accessible through myHill
- Tracks student progress toward graduation
 - Credit pacing
 - Class year, major, minor, advisor
 - Cornerstone program
 - Major and/or minor progression
- What if Audit: shows projected path, not formal change or declaration

*** Psychology majors may not declare a double major in: Neuroscience. *** Psychology majors may not declare the following minor: Secondary Education.

*** Students who are English majors and plan to double major in the following major are responsible to be sure that no more than 50% of the classes double major form is reviewed and approved: American Studies.

*** Biology majors may not declare a double major in: Biochemistry, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Environmental Studies, or Neuroscience. *** Biology majors may not declare the following minor: Biochemistry.

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myAudit: What if Considerations

- Does not allow to change class year
- Does not account for invalid combinations
- May not pull all classes into correct areas
 - Pass/Fail courses
 - Transfer credits
 - Double dips
 - Courses may satisfy multiple degree requirements
 - Credits for these courses <u>do not</u> count more than once
- Should not replace a conversation with advisor
- Any questions, edits, or overrides should be sent to the Registrar's Office for manual entry



Course Approvals

Course Approvals

- Most common reasons for course approvals:
 - Course requires permission
 - Unmet prerequisite
 - Repeating failed or withdrawn course
 - Class year or Major/minor restriction
- Full list of reasons on Registrar's website:



Course Approval Process



- 1. Fill out online form
- 2. Receive email approval or signature from faculty member (most course approvals require this)
- 3. Return/Forward the signed form to the Registrar's Office a few days before registration date
- 4. Course will be pre-coded to allow student to register for the course or the waitlist, if the class is full
