




Giving Volunteer Toolkit



What is Annual Giving?

Annual giving is Stonehill's ongoing fundraising effort to engage alumni donors in giving each fiscal year, forming strong donor relationships and raising funds for important Stonehill programs

Fiscal Year:

The Stonehill College Fund operates on a fiscal year calendar of July 1st - June 30th. For example, fiscal year 2019 (FY19) is July 1, 2018 - June 30, 2019.

So, why give?

Every student deserves access to all the experiences Stonehill has to offer

*it also factors into our national rankings

LYBUNT:

“Last Year But Not This Year”

Refers to donors who gave in the last fiscal year but haven't given yet in this one. LYBUNTs are the most reliable donors for Stonehill.

VS

SYBUNT:

“Some Years But Not This Year”

Refers to donors who have given within the past few years but not the last one. These donors sometimes just miss a year here or there. Also known as Lapsed.

GOLD:

Graduates Of the Last Decade

PC:

President's Council donors make gifts of \$1,000 or more. GOLD President's Council represents recent graduate donors who make gifts of \$500 or more.

Who's who?



1948 Loyalty Society:

Membership is comprised of alumni who have made gifts to the College for at least four out of six consistent years and GOLD alumni who have contributed for three out of six consistent years with gifts of any amount to any designated area at Stonehill.

Reasons for Giving



Sharing your own personal stories of why you give is hugely impactful to our donors. While everyone has their own reason for making a gift back to the College, here are a few to start us off:

MAKE A GIFT

Online

To make a donation online, visit stonehill.edu/giving and select the "Make a Gift Now" link, choose your fund, and fill out the secure online form.

Telephone

To make a credit card gift by phone, please call the Office of Development at (508) 565-1341.

Mail

To make a credit card (or check) gift via mail, please send your credit card number, expiration date, a daytime telephone number and instructions on your gift intent to:

Tips and Tricks



Making the Ask

Tell your own personal story for what a Stonehill education has done for you and what inspires you to give. Relay what program, experience, or initiative have made the biggest difference for you.

Your personal giving story is the best motivation for your classmates to make their own gift.

Don't be afraid to ask for a gift

Asking isn't forcing anyone to donate, rather it is inviting them to join you in giving back.

Be specific

Offering your classmate a gift range can help them figure out their commitment level. You can ask them for a class year gift (ex. if they graduated in 2016, you can ask for a gift of \$20.16) or to match the gift you made.

Participation is key

General Letter

Dear____,

Personal Letter

Phone Ask

Give your name and say you are part of the Class of XXXX and calling for Stonehill College.

It's hard to believe that it's been XX years since we were at Stonehill together as students. What an amazing experience! I'm helping reach out to some of our classmates on behalf of Stonehill and would love to talk to you more about what's going on at the College today and share with you how your support [reference past support as appropriate] directly benefits the students following in our footsteps. Do you have a couple of minutes to talk with me?"



(If yes) Make the ask:

"Great! I am calling tonight on behalf of our class and the Stonehill College Fund to ask for your support. I hope that you join me in making a gift to benefit the students at Stonehill. (Wait for a response.) You can make your gift by going online at stonehill.edu/giving. Thank you, your support is greatly appreciated."



(If no) Ask for a better time to call back, OR tell your classmate that you will follow up via email.

"I'm sorry that this is a bad time. I hope that you will make a gift to Stonehill before the end of the College's fiscal year on June 30th. Thanks for your time!"

Handling Concerns



Here are some appropriate responses to prepare you for an instance in which an alum may have an objection to giving

I'm still paying off my College Loans

I understand. However, many alumni still wanted to support Stonehill College with a gift that fits their budget. We are encouraging participation. Would a gift of \$___ be something you would feel comfortable with?

I paid enough in tuition

Actually, tuition doesn't cover the entire cost of an education at Stonehill College, or at any other school. In fact, tuition only covers about 75% of the actual cost of operating the school. Many people don't realize that alumni have always supported the Annual Fund, even when you were attending, to help with the cost of tuition. Keeping that in mind, would you consider a gift of \$___?

I'd love to but I just can't right now

I understand finances can be tight sometimes. Perhaps you would be able to consider a gift of \$___ now and you can always increase it later if your situation changes. Would that work better?

or

I can understand that the timing might not be right at the moment. You would have until June 30 to make your gift, or we could set up an installment plan also if that would be convenient for you.

I only hear from you when you want money

I'm currently unemployed

I just had a baby / I just bought a house

Congratulations! (Ask a positive question that pertains to the specific situation.) Would you like any new information to appear in the class notes section of the Alumni magazine? We have also spoken with other Alumni who are in similar situations, and we found that most could fit a small gift into their budget. Every gift helps raise our participation level.
