## Hints & Tips for Finding and Applying to Scholarships

- DO <u>NOT</u> WAIT UNTIL YOU HAVE BEEN ACCEPTED INTO A STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM TO START APPLYING FOR SCHOLARSHIPS.
- MANY APPLICATIONS ARE DUE <u>OVER ONE YEAR IN ADVANCE OF STUDYING ABROAD</u>—before you even apply for your study abroad program—START EARLY!!!
- Make good use of your academic writing skills. Revise all essays and ask for feedback on your work. If possible, schedule an appointment with the Writing Center.
- Are you a good writer? Or perhaps a talented photographer? Look for student travel writing and photography contests for extra funding ideas. For instance the Transitions Abroad writing contest: <a href="http://www.transitionsabroad.com/information/writers/student.shtml">http://www.transitionsabroad.com/information/writers/student.shtml</a>
- Ask your parents if any scholarships exist at their workplace for children of employees.
- Look in your community— funding may be available through civic, ethnic, or religious groups. For example, former **Girl Scouts** should look at <a href="http://www.cjsfoundation.org/">http://www.cjsfoundation.org/</a>.
- Are you a member of **any honor societies**? Check to see whether study abroad scholarships are offered to members of your society. For instance, **Sigma Tau Delta**, the International English Honor Society, offers study abroad scholarships to its members for up to \$3,000 per term. <a href="http://www.english.org/sigmatd/members/scholarships/">http://www.english.org/sigmatd/members/scholarships/</a>
