The Bogan Arena will elevate Skyhawks both as athletes and students, providing a dynamic space for sports competition, community engagement and student success.





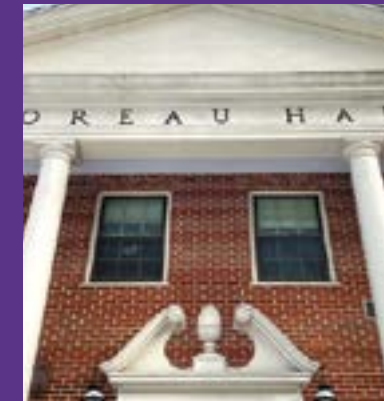

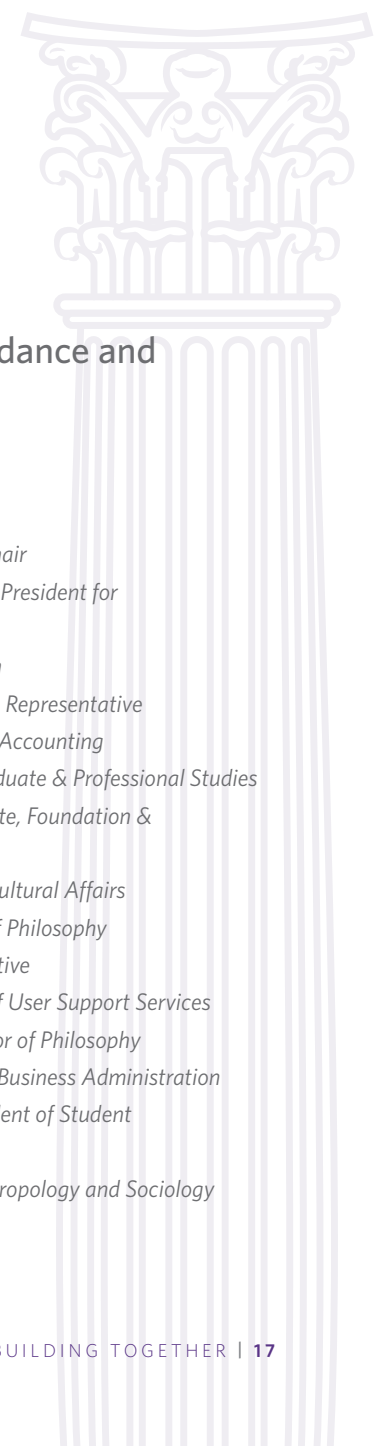


IN UNION THERE IS STRENGTH
